Here is a really simplified wedding ceremony, truly barebones stuff, and basically anything less is probably not legal.

The officiant opens the ceremony.

Officiant: Dudes, we are gathered here today to unite (first party) and (second party) in wedded matrimony. And that's cool, that's cool.

The officiant begins solemnizing the marriage and addresses the first parties.

Officiant: Do you take (second party) to be your lawfully wedded wife/husband? If so, please answer I do.

After the first party declares their intent, the officiant addresses the second party.

Officiant: Do you take (first party) to be your lawfully wedded husband/wife? If so, please answer I do.

After both parties have formally declared their intent to marry, the officiant solemnizes the marriage.

Officiant: By the authority vested in me by The Church of the Latter-Day Dude and the state of (state where the wedding is taking place), I now pronounce you (Husband or Wife) and (Husband or Wife).

The officiant closes the ceremony.

Officiant: I now introduce to everyone in attendance, and the world, Mr., and Mrs. So and so. Thank you for being witness to this joyous event.
